Do You Know Where Your Cat Is? You Do If Your Cat Is Kept Indoors All the Time

CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING HAZARDS TO OUTDOOR CATS:

- Outdoor cats get injured by fighting with other cats, dogs or wildlife. They will require more medical care than indoor cats for abscesses, bite wounds or torn ears. (Think \$\$veterinary costs\$\$).
- · Outdoor cats often get hit by cars.
- Outdoor cats can get caught and seriously injured in the fan belt of a car as they try to find warm spots in the cold weather.
- · Outdoor cats can be poisoned, either accidentally or intentionally.
- Outdoor cats are exposed to serious diseases such as Infectious Feline Anemia (FIV), Feline Leukemia (FELV), upper respiratory disease or rabies.
- Outdoor cats often get fleas, ticks or worms, all of which can threaten their health.
- · Outdoor cats can be used as live bait to train dogs for fighting.
- Outdoor cats cannot "fend" for themselves. Domestic cats depend on humans for food and shelter.
- · Outdoor cats, in general, have half the life span of indoor cats.
- Outdoor cats are simply not as protected as indoor cats, Be responsible.
 Keep your cat indoors.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO MAKE YOUR INDOOR CAT HAPPY?

- Encourage cats to exercise by providing a wide variety of toys that you rotate, a scratching post and a climbing tree. Provide a screened window or door for fresh air; or build an outdoor enclosure for your cat. It is also important to provide a clean litter box in a quiet, easily accessible location.
- Understand that cats really do want to be home with you, warm and cozy!
 Keep a tag on your cats at all times, or have a microchip implanted just in case they accidentally get out.
- · Put up special cat fencing so your cat can go out but not leave your yard.
- · Harness train your cat so he can go for walks with you.
